Responsibilities: Under the overall supervision of the GIS Unit Supervisor, the GIS Associate will carry out the following duties:

- Assist in developing and producing maps at all scales to support decision making and information dissemination processes of other sections;
- Process incoming geographic job requests, including map printing and distribution;
- Assist in collating spatial and information databases and spreadsheets:
- Assist in field data collection using GPS;
- Prepare monthly statistics on maps produced and distributed;
- Archive Mission geographic data and products for system backup;
- Assist in integrating data from several sources for use by Unit/Section;
- Manage the Unit/Section's information system of assets and supplies, including plotters, workstations, scanners, digitizers, ink cartridges, and printing papers;
- Assist in the printing of geographic products including thematic and topographic imagery maps using ESRI software;
- Update the geographic information tasks request database (GTR);
- Develop and implement capacity development and knowledge sharing program with appropriate national colleagues.

Qualifications

• Sudan National / Citizen of Sudan.

- High school diploma or equivalent is required. Technical qualification/diploma or Bachelors Degree
 in Spatial Sciences (Cartography, Geographic Information Systems/or equivalent) which involves
 geographic information and image processing programmes is required.
- At least 3 years working experience in the above mentioned areas
- Demonstrated ability to use computer applications such as Microsoft Office suites Word, PowerPoint and Excel spreadsheets.
- Arabic language skills at native level is required. Fluency in spoken and written English is required.
- Demonstrated ability to work effectively in a multicultural team of international and national staff.
- Demonstrated ability for stakeholder mobilization including Civil Society and Community Based Organizations in support of peace building and recovery activities.
- Demonstrated ability to function professionally and effectively in challenging conditions relevant to Darfur and especially in remote areas within Darfur.
- Affinity with or interest in volunteerism as a mechanism for durable development and the UN System.
- Sound security awareness.

Initial contract to be issued up to 30 June 2018. Entitlements include monthly volunteer living allowance (VLA) intended to cover housing, basic needs and utilities, equivalent to approx. US\$ 942; settling-in-grant (if applicable); life, health, and permanent disability insurance; return airfares (if applicable); resettlement allowance for satisfactory service. Monthly Well Being Differential provided to National UN Volunteers serving in hazardous duty stations (if applicable). UNV will

provide a copy of the UNV Conditions of Service to the successful candidate together with the offer of assignment.
